



In this exercise you'll learn how to set up a 30 day credit card expiration notification email to remind your customers that it's time to update their credit card on file.


1. From the **Main Navigation**, navigate to **E-Commerce > Settings**.



2. From the menu options on the left, select **Billing Automation**.




3. In the top drop down menu select "When a credit card is going to expire" and then click "Add Trigger".



4. A new window should pop open; in this window leave the top field as "Any Type" and change the second field to "30" days. Leave "Include cards that are NOT set to be billed in the future" set to "No".



5. From the actions drop down menu, select "Send an email, fax etc."



- Change the “What do you want to send?” to **“Email”**.
- Click the **“Add”** option to add a new email.

- Another new window should pop open. Set the title to **“30 Day CC Expiration Notification”**.
- Edit the subject line to say, **“Your credit card is expiring soon!”**






12. Hit return below your paragraph to move the cursor down a line. From the **“Insert”** tab above, click on the **“Merge Fields”** button.




13. At the bottom of the list, click on **“Credit Card Fields”**



14. From the list, choose **“HTML Update Link”**. Your email will now include a merge field that will show the recipient a link they can click to update their credit card information.



15. Once you're satisfied with the body of the email, click the **save** icon in the upper left that looks like a floppy disk.



16. Click the **“Close Builder”** button next to the save icon.

17. Back on the “Manage Email Template” page, scroll to the bottom and change “Ready to send?” to “yes” under **Email Readiness**.

18. Click the “**Save**” button.
19. Back on the Manage Trigger page, click the “**Save**” button.

20. Now click the “**Save Trigger**” button, and you’re done!

Add New Action

Note: You may want to set up multiple triggers for various dates approaching the expiration of a credit card. You also may want to create a task for someone internal to reach out to them in addition to asking them to update the link. The process will be nearly identical!
